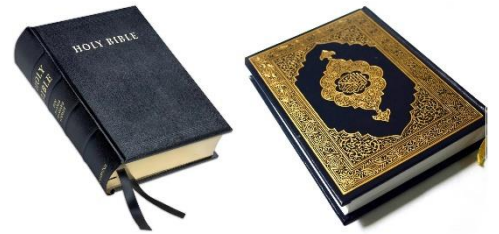


GCSE RE



What skills will I learn?

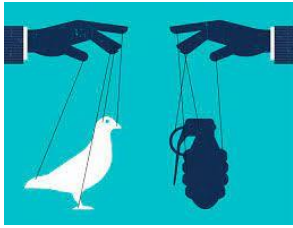
RE is an **interdisciplinary** subject. This means that it develops skills that you can apply in a lot of different careers and draw on them to help you in other subjects:

- ✓ Persuasive writing (great practice for job interviews)
- ✓ Presenting a two-sided argument (will help with College or Sixth Form and professions like law)
- ✓ A broad understanding of the fundamental beliefs of humans (very valued for those who want to do medicine)
- ✓ Problem solving (great for any job, particularly finance based jobs or trouble shooting)
- ✓ Investigative and analytical thinking (will help at College or Sixth Form and also great for a range of jobs)
- ✓ Debating (brilliant for careers where you will need to be able to persuade people: law, stockbroking etc.)

How is the course assessed?

2 exams at the end of Year 11:

Paper 1 - 1hr 45mins	Study of Religions: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Christian beliefs and practices• Islamic beliefs and practices
Paper 2 - 1hr 45mins	Thematic studies: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Relationships and families• Religion and Life• Religion, peace and conflict• Religion, crime and punishment

There are many topics that are controversial and interesting in Religious Education.

This includes topics such as: abortion, euthanasia, terrorism, animal testing, crime and the death penalty, death and the afterlife, how Christians and Muslims live their daily lives and how beliefs influence this to name but a few.
